The meeting was called to order by President Macherone, AB2IU, at 7:30 PM in the Union College Olin Hall Conference Room.

After a brief discussion, George Williams, W2CSN, made a motion to accept the minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on May 6, 2002 as published in SARA News. Ramsey Seielstad, KC2GMW, seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

George Williams, W2CSN, presented the Treasurer's Report. Millie Gittinger, KB2SWR, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. The motion was seconded by Paul Siemers, WY2F, and it passed unanimously.

George Williams, W2CSN, presented new member Robert Fountain for the Board's approval. After a short discussion, Paul Siemers, WY2F, made a motion to accept the new member. The motion was seconded by Clark Gittinger, KG2AO, and it passed unanimously.

Tim Long, W2UI, reported that we had received a thank you letter from this years recipient of the Henry Broughton, K2AE Memorial Scholarship that is administered by the ARRL Scholarship Foundation Program. We also received a letter from the ARRL announcing this years recipient. (See related story this issue.)

Raleigh Keeter, K2RI, reported that he had a box of safety orange vests for operators to wear while doing public service events. Raleigh will give the vests to Ken Klikeman, AA2CW, for our volunteers use during these events.

Clark Gittinger, KG2AO, announced that he would assume the duties of the Editor of SARA News. It was also understood that Rob Leiden, KR2L, would fill in when Clark was out of town. We use PageMaker software. Clark will contact Phil Bradway, KB2HQ, and make arrangements to transfer needed materials. Brian Macherone, AB2IU, announced that Dennis Hudson, N2LBT, resigned from the "production" phase of issuing SARA News. We will all explore methods and resources available to obtain the duplicating services at reduced cost. Tim Long, W2UI, said that he would continue to perform the mailing and emailing duties to SARA members.

Brian Macherone, AB2IU, reported that Bob Raffaele, W2XM, had resigned as Chairman of the Membership Committee. This position remains open. Brian stated that we need to fill this important position

ASAP and that we need to determine why members are not renewing. Discussions of meeting place followed. We all agreed that we would explore other locations and organizations that we have contacts and relationships with.

Brian Macherone, AB2IU, announced that Rob Leiden, KR2L, would continue as Chairman of the Public Relations Committee. Rudy Dehn, W2JVF, announced that he would continue as Chairman of the RFI Committee. Millie Gittinger, KB2SWR, announced those programs that had been scheduled thus far and stated that the Program Committee would meet later this week.

Tim Long, W2UI, and Paul Siemers, WY2F, provided a Field Day report. The utility box trailer that we bought used last year has areas of severe rust inside the box beams that form the main frame members of the trailer. These frame members must be replaced within an estimated 2 years for the trailer to continue to be safe and useful. Tim made a motion that we replace the side rails of the trailer frame at a cost not to exceed \$100. The estimated cost is based on replacement channel and welding rod. Paul and Tim will do the cutting and welding. The motion was seconded by George Williams, W2CSN, and it passed unanimously.

Paul Siemers, WY2F, made a motion to adjourn at 9:17 PM and Brian Macherone, AB2IU, concurred.

## Directions to Olin Hall

Enter Union College via the entrance at Nott St. and Van Vranken Ave. Bear left at the first road junction, drive around a curve, and bear right into a parking lot. From the lot, walk south through another parking lot (usually full) and along a short walkway, passing Achilles Rink on the left and the utilities plant and the Engineering Lab on the right. You will come to an east-west road with a three story brick building (Butterfield Hall) across the road ahead of you and the athletic field to your left. Turn right (West) on the road and pass two traffic barriers. After the second barrier, bear somewhat left along a relatively new sidewalk which goes around the new Olin Hall to its glass front entrance. The meeting room is just inside, to the left. Walking Distance 350 Yards.

Applications and/or further information about the Broughton Scholarship may be obtained from the ARRL Foundation at the above address. Applications and supporting paper work must be received by the Foundation before February 1<sup>st</sup> to be given consideration.
