

January Meeting "Trim But Deadly" at the SARA meeting on
January 6, 2003

"What? Did they still use rotary spark gaps in 1944?"

"Trim but deadly" is what they were called in World War II, thin skinned but armed to the teeth, the feisty little Destroyer Escorts were sent in harms way of guns and torpedoes in the Atlantic, and kamikazes in the Pacific. And they were expendable! Of some 565 DEs that were built, only one remains afloat in the United States. The USS SLATER, DE-766, is now "home ported" in the Hudson River at Albany. Restored to its 1945 wartime configuration, the SLATER is open to the public for tours as an historic Destroyer Escort Museum. The ships armament of 3 inch guns, 40 mm guns, 20 mm guns, hedgehogs and depth charges are all original. The radio room is equipped with original Navy transmitters and receivers (boat anchors), many being restored to operating condition by a volunteer crew consisting mostly of local hams. Using the callsign WW2DEM, SLATER participates in amateur radio special events using the ships original restored longwire antennas and when possible, original Navy equipment. At the January SARA meeting, Gerry Jones, K2AYM, will present a slideshow including some of SLATERS radar and radio equipment as well as the refrigeratorsized low frequency transmitter type TAJ built by GE in Schenectady in 1944. Some of the features of the equipment more interesting to hams will be discussed in some detail.

Gerry Jones, K2AYM, is part of the team restoring the radio equipment and other electronic systems aboard the Slater. The Slater restoration team is frequently represented at Crossgates Mall in Guilderland where more information about the Slater and its restoration is available.

Directions for Niskayuna High School Meeting Rooms D207-D208

Enter the school grounds at the traffic light just north of the Nott Street major intersection on Balltown Road. Drive to the road intersection in front of the main school entrance, and turn right at this intersection. Drive around to the back of the school, past a narrow point where the school and the adjacent shopping center are close together. Park in the first area of the rear parking lot that you come to. Enter the school at the entrance near to a large circular fan mounted on the side of the wall of the nearby building extension. (This extension has some fenced in electrical boxes at its end.) Turn Left, walk down the hallway to an intersecting hallway, and turn left again. The meeting rooms are on your left.

For those of us who want to play with GPS units, the entrance doorway is at N 42deg. 49.070min., W 73deg. 53.325min.

K2AE Repeater News and Request for Donations

The big event in the last few weeks is the arrival of our new professional duplexer for the 220 MHz repeater station. This was a high cost item. For many years we operated the 220 repeater with a separate transmit and receive antenna. This allowed us to use a modified military set of cavities for duplexing with fairly good isolation. Unfortunately, during a heavy storm, the lower antenna being used for transmit was demolished. As a result the 220 repeater has been off the air temporarily. The duplexer will allow us to use the one antenna high on the tower.

The key performance characteristic of a repeater, other than location, is the isolation between the transmitter and the receiver so that a high sensitivity receiver can be used without having its sensitivity reduced by noise from the transmitter. Using two antennas with one of the antennas in less than optimum position means either the received or transmitted signal is poor. Now we will be able to use the 220 high performance antenna high on the tower for both transmit and receive. Work is proceeding to get the 220 repeater ready to go back on the air.

The 6-meter repeater has been ready to back on the air, but we are waiting for re-coordination of the frequency since it was off for longer than the minimum period set by the frequency coordination council, UNYREPCO. This is a newly refurbished professional GE repeater and should give excellent coverage.

There has been a very large amount of personal effort being put into the repeaters by several people, but I do want to call out the work especially of Scott Krone N2YCA on the 2-meter and 440 K2AE repeaters, and Don Miller W2EWY on the 6-meter repeater.

With all this activity, the repeater fund went down into the ground, and significant money was given from the SARA general fund to the repeater, especially the new 220 duplexer. We have not had a repeater fund drive in several years, and we are now requesting donations. You will be hearing more of this. Checks can be written to SARA, and marked "Repeater Fund".
