VHF - UHF - Microwave Contest

Those of us who attended the May SARA meeting heard all about contesting on frequencies of 50 MHz on up. For those who want to try it, the next chance is the weekend of June 14 -15. The W2SZ group, which includes a fair number of SARA members, will be at it again, on Mt. Greylock and far flung Rover stations. This effort is major and it usually wins!

The easiest way to join this effort is to become a rover (or assist a Rover). This consists of driving a car full of radio equipment around the countryside to predetermined sites in different grid squares, from which you contact the Greylock base station on as many microwae amateur bands as possible. (You can run your own contest as well). The W2SZ group provides the equipment for 900 MHz on up to 24 GHz, you need a 2M HT minimum plus a 440 Mhz HT for base-rover communication. (50 and 222 MHz HT's are also desirable.)

There are also a few spots for hard core dedicated souls on the mountain. This is a major 5 day committment, however.

In any case, get on the air on the high bands, whether on your own on your own high point or as a W2SZ member. For more information, e-mail Dick Frey at frey@crd.ge.com. The contest rules are published in the May issue of QST.
