Programs: Paul Siemers, WY2F, confirmed that Jim Lyons will be the guest speaker for the February meeting and will talk on Wind Turbines

Repeater Committee: SARA's new 6 meter repeater is on the air. Scott Krone, N2YCA, recommends that we wait to implement the 6 meter SCEN until after the operation has proven reliable.

VE Sessions: The team does not plan to conduct a test session prior to the February meeting since no requests have been received.

Anniversary Committee: Dan Whelan, N2UD contacted the Glen Sanders Mansion, obtained detailed pricing information, and provided proposed menu choices. Due to the overwhelming advantages of this choice for SARA's 75th Anniversary Dinner, further consideration of other venues was discontinued. Paul Siemers, WY2F, made a motion to have a 75th Anniversary Dinner. The motion was seconded by Millie Gittinger, KB2SWR, and it passed unanimously. Paul Siemers, WY2F, made a motion to hold the dinner at The Glenn Sanders Mansion. This motion was seconded by Millie Gittinger, KB2SWR, and it too passed unanimously.
