SUITSAT

From the NASA website (edited by N2UD)

One of the strangest satellites in the history of the space age is about to go into orbit. Launch date: Feb. 3rd. That's when astronauts onboard the International Space Station (ISS) will hurl an empty spacesuit overboard. The spacesuit is the satellite "SuitSat" for short. "SuitSat is a Russian brainstorm," explains Frank Bauer of NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center. "Some of our Russian partners in the ISS program, mainly a group led by Sergey Samburov, had an idea: Maybe we can turn old spacesuits into useful satellites." SuitSat is a first test of that idea. SuitSat can be heard by anyone on the ground. "All you need is an antenna (the bigger the better) and a radio receiver that you can tune to 145.990 MHz FM," says Bauer.

Note: In the Schenectady area the ISS and "Suitsat" may be receivable around these times but check the [NASA Website](#) for exact times or changes: Feb 3 - 510 am; Feb 4 ? 4:20 am; Feb 5 ? 4:00 am; Feb 8 -7:10 am; Feb 10 ? 6:10 am; Feb 11 ? 6:50 am

Use [Science@NASA's J-Pass](#) utility to find out exact times. Because the ISS and SuitSat share similar orbits, predictions for one will serve for the other. There is about a 5-to-10 minute flyby," advises Bauer, and this is what you'll hear: SuitSat transmits for 30 seconds, pauses

Board Meeting

Board Meeting January 4th, 2006 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President, Dan Whelan, N2UD, at 7:00 PM in a classroom near the New Cafeteria, room number unknown, at Niskayuna High School.

Minutes: Secretary Ramsay D. Seielstad, KC2GMW, read the December Minutes as submitted for publication in SARA News. George Williams, W2CSN, made a motion to accept the minutes. Hal Post, AK2E, seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: George Williams, W2CSN, presented the Treasurer's Report. Hal Post, AK2E, made a motion to accept the report. The motion was seconded by Ramsay D. Seielstad, KC2GMW, and it passed unanimously.

Correspondence: Ramsay D. Seielstad, KC2GMW, reported that, since the last Board Meeting, we had received the one renewal, a Bank of America statement, a Verizon statement and a solicitation from Deluxe Business Checks.

New Members: George Williams, W2CSN, reported that John Ferarri, WA2LUE, a Union College Student had applied for membership and included a check for dues. The Board and SARA welcome John, WA2LUE to the club.

Programs: Hal Post, AK2E, reported that the January 2006 program will be Dan Whelan, N2UD, and will discuss station improvements.

Newsletter: Dennis Hudson, N2LBT, provided Dan Whelan, N2UD, a report that he mailed 76 SARA News via the USPS and emailed another 52 copies.

RFI: Rudy Dehn, W2JVF, reported no interference complaints so far.

Old Business: Dan Whelan, N2UD, reports that the Holiday Party was an enjoyable evening and well attended. George Williams, W2CSN, also reported that the expenses for the event were less than anticipated and a small surplus was the result.

Dan Whelan, N2UD, reports that Dennis Hudson, N2LBT, has taken over maintenance of the SARA website, www.k2ae.org in addition to his newsletter responsibilities.

New Business: Dan Whelan, N2UD, reminded Board Members that we should begin considering formation of the nominating committee for the upcoming elections at the June Business Meeting. Members interested should contact Dan.

Dan Whelan, N2UD, presented to the board the reminder that postage rates were rising January 8th. Dan also noted that the Postal Rate Commission had also alluded that there may be another postage increase considered within the next couple of years. Dan noted that of the 76 SARA newsletters mailed this month, 49 of the recipients have email addresses and could receive the newsletter via that method.

Dan proposed that as postage costs rise, Board members will need to consider at some future time whether to absorb the addition postage costs without increasing dues, increasing dues to cover the increased postage costs or to provide an incentive to members electing to receive the newsletter via email and not raising dues for all members.

Dan Whelan, N2UD, also reported that he has received some complaints about the newsletter not being received by a few members. Dan, N2UD, researched the reports and determined the source of problem is not clearly able to be identified. Dan, N2UD, directed that in an attempt to identify the source of the problem, the Board should audit the membership database. Dan, N2UD, directed the Secretary, Ramsay D. Seielstad, KC2GMW, obtain a complete copy of the membership database from Tim Long, W2UI, and begin the audit and provide a copy of the data and the results of the audit to him.

A complaint was received from Howard Friedman, WA2AFD, about the use of derogatory language on the repeater on December 29th, 2005. Dan Whelan, N2UD, will contact Howard and follow up on the details of the complaint. Dan will also contact the repeater control operators about being more vigilant about monitoring the repeater and taking the appropriate measures.

Bob Raffaele, W2XM, forwarded an email offering a suggestion that the membership meetings would be more attractive if beverages were provided. Discussions determined that to obtain access to the coffee maker at Niskayuna High is difficult, that we become obligated to clean up after the meeting, that we have noted a lack of volunteers stepping forward to fulfill vacancies, that members have access to vending machines in the cafeteria for carbonated beverages and water as well as a Starbuck's Coffee shop at St. James Plaza next to the high school and the expenditures, on a regular basis, to provide a majority of the membership with a variety of bever-



ages can be a significant budgetary expense.

It was determined that since no budget item was adopted for regular expenditures on refreshments and no volunteers seem available to accept the responsibilities of providing and preparing refreshments, and cleaning up after the meeting, the matter was tabled.

Hal Post, AK2E, suggested that there is a need for a small Public Address system for the meetings. Ramsay D. Seielstad, KC2GMW, reported that the school can provide a podium with the capabilities but that advance notice is required and the reliability of school personnel having the equipment present for the meeting has not been good in the past.

Dan Whelan, N2UD, has volunteered to bring a small system, he has access to, to test the functionality at meetings. If the performance is satisfactory, the board will consider at a future time to purchase a similar system for the club.

Ramsay D. Seielstad, KC2GMW, reported that Ray Rivet had sent a letter indicating he had various older radio media and equipment in storage and was offering the club the opportunity to evaluate and take possession of items of interest. Rudy Dehn, W2JVF, volunteered to evaluate the items and determine the club's interest in the offered items or provide alternative avenues to make the items available to other amateurs who might be interested.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 PM.

for 30 seconds, and then repeats. "This is SuitSat-1, RSORS," the transmission begins, followed by a prerecorded greeting in five languages. The greeting contains "special words" in English, French, Japanese, Russian, German and Spanish for students to record and decipher.

Next comes telemetry: temperature, battery power, mission elapsed time. "The telemetry is stated in plain language?in English," says Bauer. Everyone will be privy to SuitSat's condition. Bauer adds, "Suitsat 'talks' using a voice synthesizer. It's pretty amazing." The transmission ends with a Slow Scan TV picture. Of what? "We're not telling," laughs Bauer. "It's a mystery picture."

Bauer expects SuitSat's batteries to last 2 to 4 days. "Although longer is possible," he allows. After that, SuitSat will begin a slow silent spiral into Earth's atmosphere. Weeks or months later, no one knows exactly when, it will become a brilliant fireball over some part of Earth. A fitting end for a trailblazer. For more information see www.suitsat.org
