Houston, TX, May 23, 2012: Houston area based Brazos Valley Amateur Radio Club will celebrate its fifth year of participation in the annual Museum Ships Weekend Event, June 2-3, 2012 by offering a special commemorative certificate to amateur stations who contact all five Texas Based Museum ships during the event. The five museum ships and their call signs include the Submarine USS Cavalla and Destroyer Escort USS Stewart (KK5W) in Galveston, Texas, The Battleship USS Texas (NA5DV), in La Porte Texas, The Tall Ship Elissa (N5E) also in Galveston and the Aircraft Carrier USS Lexington (W5LEX) in Corpus Christi, Texas.

To earn the Texas Navy Certificate, amateur stations must submit proof of contact (Log Extract) with all five Texas Museum ships to QSL Manager, KK5W along with a #10 SASE. The address is in QRZ.com. Look for us around 28.360 21.360 18.160 14.260 7.260, 3.860, Plus or minus QRM.

Museum Ships Weekend is an annual operating event sponsored worldwide by the Battleship New Jersey Amateur Radio Station with more than 90 ships participating this year. We decided to put in a special Texas twist to the event to commemorate our five years of taking part, said Ron Litt, K5HM, one of the Event Coordinators.

The Texas Navy Certificate is a cooperative effort between four different area clubs, In addition to the Brazos Valley club, members of the Battleship Texas Amateur Radio Station, The Tidelands Amateur Radio Society and the South Texas Amateur Radio Club are participating as well.

Jack was a long time member and supporter of SARA. He gave a fine presentation about his work at the 1980 Winter Olympics in Lake Placid.

Jack G. Coates, 90, of Niskayuna, passed away Wednesday, May 2, 2012 in the comfort of his home surrounded by his family.

Jack was born in Fleurus, Belgium, son of the late Christopher O. and Germaine Bille Coates. He lived in St. Helens, England where he attended Liverpool Wireless College and was chief radio officer in the British Merchant Marines from 1939 to 1946.

Jack came over to the United States in 1948 where he met and married Lou Carolyn King, January 31, 1948. He started work with the New York Telephone Co. on March 8, 1948 and retired in 1986.

Jack worked at the Winter Olympics in Lake Placid in 1980 on the microwave system communications. He was a ham radio operator {K2HUX, Advanced} and a member of MARS, SARA (Schenectady Amateur Radio Association) and IEEE.

Jack is survived by his wife of 64 years, Lou Carolyn Coates; son, Christopher (Jo Ann) Coates of Dickinson, ND; daughter, Elizabeth (Dennis) Dalpe of Niskayuna, NY; grandchildren, Kathleen (Jim) Alcombright of Clifton Park, NY, Gregory Dalpe of Niskayuna, NY, Captain Cortney (Brandon) Zuercher of Lynn Haven, FL, Trevor Coates of Dickinson, ND; and several nieces and nephews. He is also survived by his sister, Jeannine Lloyd. A private family service was held at home.
