SARA FIELD DAY 2012

Tim, W2UI

I don't need to remind the 30 or so members that participated in Field Day that they had fun. They already know that! By almost every measure, Field Day was a huge success. We found a new site and everybody liked it. We saved money by not having to rent a porta-potti. The Niskayuna Recreation Board is happy that their facility was used for such a good community purpose. We were invited back. We found out that the site has good propagation



and low noise. It is centrally located and convenient for emergency gas and ice runs. The SARA generator ran flawlessly. C100 has a new generator which also ran flawlessly and is large enough to run both air conditioners. We qualified for almost all bonus points. We tried for the satellite bonus; we'll get it next year. The GOTA station made 30 contacts. We didn't have the opportunity to test the drainage of the field (the weather was fantastic). The watermelon was sweet and cold. We have a list of good ideas to

improve the effort for next year.

Mr. Cranky Pants reports that participation was down. We didn't get on the air fully until around 4PM on Saturday. We only made 727 Q's total on all bands and all modes (not including the GOTA). Back in the 80's, we would make that many contacts



on one band! We ran all 5 stations for a fraction of the 24 hour period. The relatively few that showed up worked way too hard and didn't have the energy to sustain radio operations throughout the night. Relief operators didn't show up.

Suggested changes for next year include: (1) Eliminate the tent and the work required to put it up. The pavilion is long enough to put food and socialization at the kitchen end and radio operations at the opposite end. Center the antenna plan on the radio end of the pavilion. (2) Replace full-wave loop antennas with half-wave inverted vees. It's difficult to intertwine loop wires with guy ropes. (3) Start serving food with lunch on Friday. When people leave to eat, it's at least



an hour before we get them back, if they come back at all. (4) Measure and permanently label the lengths of all coaxial cable. Originally they were all measured and cut to optimally fit the antenna plan. (5) Figure out a support for the SSB triband beam that is easy to put up. No steel towers and no fiberglass poles. We need a beam antenna on both CW and SSB. (6) Configure the power distribution cables so that one cable can be used as an extension for another. (7) Insert your idea for increasing participation here...


