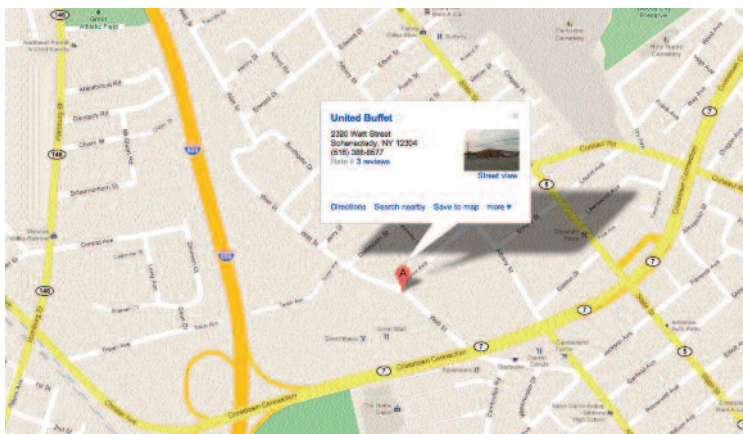
Holiday Party, December 3th, 2012 at 6 PM, United Buffet, Watt Street, Schenectady

Ever since my husband AK2E and I strung up the antenna he designed for my station, an inverted Windom antenna that criss-crosses most of the trees in the back yard, I have had the task "to keep an eye" on the antenna. It is easy to do when the walnut tree, maples and willows are bare of leaves, but more challenging in the spring and summer. My neighbors, all unfamiliar with amateur radio. see me in the back yard, staring into the trees and walking around in seemingly random fashion. I tighten the black nylon lead lines where necessary, check the wires (hard to do with these old eyes) and make sure that the connectors are free of debris. If you participate in the NYSPTEN Traffic net, you will notice my signal is usually strong and clear, a testament to AK2E's genius in designing antennas.

Recently, I was observed counting the bricks of the chimney on the north side of the house and measuring the height of an individual brick. That was the second step in establishing a 2-Meter beam antenna we disconnected from another ham's house. Hal will get the coax and the clamps, and I will sweet-talk somebody into climbing up on a tall ladder to install the antenna. I am working on Mark, my handiman, who will be fixing some eaves on that side of the house before the snow flies.

Most of the trees in my yard are bare now. I can see the antenna wires, if I squint just so.

I would so look forward to getting your description on your antenna system to be published here.
