Implementing Power and Grounding Solutions

Ray Feurstein

The January Program features Ray Feurstein presenting part of a training course he developed for engineers and technicians on evaluating international communication systems.

Ray is a retired Verizon Field engineer of 30 years. One of his duties was as a domestic and international systems analytical investigator for power and grounding and a communications disaster recovery and counter terrorism strategic planner. In this role he developed a process for testing and implementing power and grounding solutions for multimillion dollar companies as well as military, government/private nuclear facilities and law enforcement groups. This evaluation process included antenna tower, commercial and standby power sources and the grounding required to maintain large communications system. He also developed a training program for Verizon techs and engineers so they can evaluate systems globally. This presentation is one part of a three and a half day course study and certification for this audit/evaluation process. Ray holds 2 US patents and is working on a third at this time.

The third incorporates a high energy photon emitter that will be able to divert particle energy (plasma lightning) away from building structures prone to lightning strikes.
