SKYWARN Recognition Day (SRD)

Saturday, December 5, 2015

The 17th annual SKYWARN Recognition Day (SRD) on-the-air event is set for Saturday, December 5.

SKYWARN Recognition Day celebrates the contributions that volunteer SKYWARN radio operators make to the National Weather Service. During SRD, SKYWARN operators visit NWS offices and contact other radio operators across the world.

The volunteer SKYWARN program comprises nearly 290,000 trained severe weather spotters -- many of them radio amateurs -- who identify severe storms and provide NWS forecasters with reports of local weather conditions during severe weather events.

The Albany Weather Service radios will only be active from 8am to 4pm on Saturday. SKYWARN trained licensed hams are welcome to visit and operate. You must RSVP and register for the event.

K2AE Repeaters Guidelines

K2AE Repeaters are open and visitor friendly.

1. There will be a control operator monitoring at all times. If there is no control operator, the repeater will be unavailable. (97.103 and 97.105)
2. Control operators will not discourage anyone from using the repeater.
3. Conduct on the repeaters should be governed by common sense and courtesy. Conversations should be in plain language and suitable for all listeners. (97.112 and .113)
4. No commercial business use is allowed.
5. Pause a few seconds between transmissions. The repeater will recycle. This gives a chance for other users or emergency traffic to call in. (Give even a longer pause in Winter.)
6. If someone calls "Break", operators will yield the frequency for emergency traffic. Yielding to a "breaking" or new station is common courtesy. New York State and Federal law prohibit interference with emergency traffic.
7. Operators are encouraged to use simplex whenever possible. Operators are encouraged to use the minimum power necessary to maintain clear contact, i.e. 50 Watts or more is not appropriate in close proximity to the repeater when 1 or 5 watts achieve full quieting. (97.313)
8. Use of the repeater for non-SARA public service events is prohibited unless permission from the Trustee is obtained. Please forward requests to: ak2e@arrl.net.
9. In the event of an emergency (SKYWARN, flooding, weather conditions or other emergencies) control operators will turn the repeater on if it is down.

Not in the Study Guides / Helpful Operating Tips

Listen, listen, and listen, before joining a QSO. Do not change the subject or bulldoze others that were part of the active QSO.

When there are more than two persons in a QSO, at the end of your transmission give your call sign, and turn it to the next in line. The ID is a courtesy to the others in the QSO, and if you don't get your turn back, or have to leave for some reason, you have met the FCC requirement of ID (ing) once every 10 minutes or at the end of your transmission. If a station wants to join the QSO bring them in immediately, not after your self-allotted dissertation. Keep the sequence of rotation.

Interference! HF and VHF/UHF from time to time may be interfered with. **Do not recognize, comment or otherwise dignify the interference.** If the interference continues, simply sign, keep quiet and listen on the input frequency and record the signal strength. Forward the information to the Trustee. If interference is acknowledged that you are having a QSO with an unidentified station, which is not allowed by FCC rules. You are also making the interferer very happy. OO's, the FCC and the Trustee cannot help a willing station be free from the interference. You only make the problem worse. So make no remarks about the interference. **It is better to lose 10 minutes of talk than have an ever expanding problem.**



Please remember Amateur Radio is not for everyone. We will conduct on the air activities as ladies and gentlemen. Never say anything that is hurt full or disrespectful of another person. Many hams and non-hams listen to our QSO's; give them a good impression of Amateur Radio hobby.
