Modest HF Contesting

The Schenectady Amateur Radio Association (SARA) will hold its March meeting with a presentation by SARA member Al Kozakiewicz AB2ZY discussing how to be effective and yet operate a modest amateur radio station while in High Frequency Communications (DX-ing). His presentation will emphasize antennas and operating practices.

The SARA meeting will be held Monday, March 7, 2011 at 7 PM in the Little Theatre of the Niskayuna High School on Balltown Road. Attendees should enter the school through the cafeteria entrance located on the side of the school, adjacent to the Nott Street Extension school parking lot.

Amateur radio operators and interested individuals are invited to attend.

Winterfest 2011 A Success

On what could only be called a perfect day for an outdoor winter sports event, local amateurs took part in Winterfest 2011 at Indian Meadows Park in Glenville on Saturday, February 5. This is the third year in a row that amateurs have participated and clearly the best in terms

of attendance. Amateurs have been asked to have a presence at Winterfest to introduce amateur radio to event attendees by Armand Canastraro, WA2EQW, Chairman of the Town of Glenville Park Planning Commission.

Schenectady County again made the C100 County Emergency Communications Vehicle available for use as an operating location. The C100 comes equipped with a 2-Meter rig that is ready to go. Participants provided HF capability. Tim, W2UI, brought a Yaesu 857D, a dual band, 20- and 40-Meter dipole antenna, and a set of homebrew paddles. Jim, K2PK, brought an ICOM 706 Mk II, ICOM AT-180 antenna tuner, and Bencher paddle for CW. Some of the visitors were intrigued by CW operation.

Setup and tear down for this event is quick and easy as the antenna is hung in trees near the C100, a feedline run through a window, and the radio(s) are connected. Tim, W2UI, and Jim, K2PK, hung the antenna on Friday afternoon so everything was ready on Saturday morning after a little more antenna tweaking.

Gary, N2KUN, and others worked the crowd, encouraging attendees to visit the C100, see the demonstrations, and to send Radiograms to friends and relatives. Several amateurs in the group demonstrated HF operating

Unfortunately precipitation eventually drove them indoors. While the amateurs were handing the weather just fine, it was wreaking havoc with the pamphlets and brochures. This popular event draws amateurs from across the Capital District, providing them with an opportunity to show others their hobby, do some operating, teach and learn, and spend time with other amateurs.
